SPECIFIC CHANGES: Removes references to Health Division. All references to the Health Division in these regulations are replaced with references to the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (Division) to consistent with Senate Bill (SB) 395.

4. NEED FOR AND PURPOSE: Modification of NAC 278.020 to NAC 278.520 (inclusive) to reflect changes to the Subdivision of Land regulations. This regulation completes the transfer of authorities covered by SB 395. SB395, passed in the 2005 Legislative session transferred statutory and regulatory authorities for Subdivision Review Programs (Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 278) from the Nevada Division of Health to the NDEP. The above referenced regulations were originally adopted by the State Board of Health in 1982 in order to implement the statutory responsibilities of NRS 278. These responsibilities were transferred to NDEP by SB 395. These responsibilities include the review of tentative maps and approval of final subdivision maps. Final map approval, as amended by SB 395, is found in NRS 278.377.
