ORDER REGARDING PETITIONS TO INTERVENE BY ROCKVIEW FARMS AND AMARGOSA CITIZENS FOR THE ENVIRONMENT (ACE)

On March 31, 2009, this matter came for a preliminary hearing before a panel of the State Environmental Commission ("Commission") on Rockview Farms' Petition to Intervene, Amargosa Citizens for the Environment's ("ACE") Request for Order to Intervene, and Rockview Farms' Opposition to [ACE's] Petition for Leave to Intervene. Appellant John Bosta appeared and represented himself. Appellant Antonio Guerra Martinez appeared and represented himself. Respondent Nevada Division of Environmental Protection ("NDEP") appeared and was represented by its counsel, Bill Frey, Esq. and Janet Hess, Esq. Rockview Farms, Inc. appeared and was represented by its counsel, Jim Butler, Esq. and John Zimmerman, Esq. ACE appeared and was represented by its counsel, John Marshall, Esq.

After considering the written petitions to intervene and the opposition, and after hearing the arguments of Bosta and Martinez and counsel for NDEP, ACE and Rockview Farms, and good cause appearing, the panel finds that Rockview Farms as the permittee is a necessary party to the appeal.

The panel further finds that ACE filed its petition for leave to intervene on February 13, 2009, more than 10 calendar days after Bosta and Martinez filed their notice of appeal in November 2007. ACE represented that the reason for the delay was that it first filed a form for a declaratory order on groundwater monitoring at Ponderosa Dairy, which the Commission considered at its February 11, 2009 meeting and denied, in part, because it would circumvent the contested case process. ACE also represented that it was not filing a separate appeal, that it would be bound by the issues raised in Bosta's and Martinez's appeals, that no prejudice would occur because the appeal process had not occurred, and that it would get the appeals moving if its petition were granted. Bosta and Martinez represented that they had not

pushed their appeals because they could not afford counsel. ACE, Bosta and Martinez all agreed that they would present one case at the appeal hearing if ACE's petition for leave to intervene were granted. IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Rockview Farms' Petition to Intervene is GRANTED. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to NAC 445B.8915, ACE's Request for Order to Intervene is GRANTED on the condition that Bosta and Martinez understand that ACE will be their legal representative and their appeals will be consolidated pursuant to NAC 445B.8957.
