5) Permanent Regulatory Petition R130-22 - Bureau of Safe Drinking Water (For Possible Action)

R130-22 proposes to increase the fees for the Division's environmental Laboratory Certification Program (LCP).

6) Permanent Regulatory Petition R113-22 - Bureau of Water Quality Planning (For Possible Action)

R113-22 proposes to amend the Nevada Administrative Code to establish provisions for antidegradation protection of surface waters of the State as required by Nevada Revised Statute 445A.565, and to set forth a process for classifying certain surface waters of the State which have exceptional water quality condition, unique water quality characteristic, or ecological, aesthetic, or recreational value, as Ecological, Aesthetic or Recreational Waters. This classification will provide a higher level of antidegradation protection to maintain and protect these water quality conditions or special values.

Members of the public can inspect copies of any regulations to be adopted at the State Library and Archives in Carson City (**100 Stewart Street**), and at the offices of the Division of Environmental Protection in Carson City and Las Vegas. The Carson City office is located at **901 South Stewart Street**, **Suite 4001**, and the Las Vegas office at **375 East Warm Springs Road**, **Suite 200**.

As required by the provisions of chapters <u>233B</u> and <u>241</u> of Nevada Revised Statutes, the public notice for this hearing was posted at the following locations: the Bryan Building (**901 South Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada**); the offices of the Division of Environmental Protection in Las Vegas (**375 East Warm Springs Road, Suite 200**), the Nevada Division of Minerals, **400 W.
