1. Does this proposed regulation impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a small business?

ANSWER: No. Part of the proposed regulation adds a requirement for certain electric generating units to have best available retrofit technology (BART) installed and to comply with specified emission limitations for NO_x, SO₂ and PM₁₀. This BART requirement only impacts two large companies: Sierra Pacific Resources and its subsidiaries Sierra Pacific Power Company and Nevada Power Company, and Southern California Edison Company. The adopt-by-reference update imposes no economic burdens.

2. Does this proposed regulation restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business?

ANSWER: No.
