On March 25, 2020, the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) held an enforcement conferences with Lin Cubing Inc. to discuss supporting information regarding the draft Notice of Alleged Violation and Order (NOAV) Nos. 2768 and 2771. As a result of that meeting, NDEP formally issued the above NOAVs via certified mail on February 24, 2021. See attachment.

Upon formal issuance of the NOAVs, NDEP notified Lin Cubing Inc. of its appeal rights pursuant to NRS 445B.340 and NRS 445B.360. Lin Cubing Inc. did not appeal the NOAVs. Therefore, the State Environmental Commission (SEC) will determine the appropriate penalty for the violations contained in the above referenced NOAVs on Wednesday, June 9, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. at the Richard H. Bryan Building, Tahoe Conference Room (2nd Floor) located at 901 South Stewart Street, Carson City. Additionally, the meeting will be video conferenced to the Grant Sawyer Building, Red Rock Conference room, located at 555 East Washington Avenue, Las Vegas. It will also be held virtually. Pursuant to NRS 445B.640(1), the SEC may approve an administrative penalty of not more than \$10,000 per day per violation. During the June 9th meeting, NDEP will provide the SEC with a brief overview of the NOAVs and the recommendation for an administrative penalty of \$4,000.00 for NOAV 2768 and a penalty of \$15,000 for NOAV No. 2771, totaling \$19,000.00. These recommended penalties were calculated using a penalty matrix previously approved by the SEC.

Although your presence is not required at this meeting, you or a representative may wish to attend to speak on behalf of Lin Cubing Inc.

The SEC may, without further notice, take administrative action against Lin Cubing Inc. if the SEC determines that such administrative action is warranted after it considers NOAV Nos. 2768 and 2771.

Dear Mr. Lu:

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) alleges that Lin Cubing Inc. (Lin Cubing) has violated one or more regulatory requirements and/or conditions of Class III Air Quality Operating Permit (AQOP) AP2048-3568.

On March 25, 2020, NDEP held an enforcement conference with Lin Cubing to discuss the violations alleged in Notice of Alleged Violation (NOAV) Nos. 2768, 2769, 2770, 2771, 2843 and 2844. The conference was held to clarify the circumstances of the alleged violation, provide an opportunity for Lin Cubing to provide evidence demonstrating that the alleged violations did not occur, or efforts made to mitigate the violation.

Based on the information provided during the enforcement conference, NDEP has determined that issuance of NOAV Nos. 2768, 2769, 2770, 2771, 2843, and 2844 is warranted and that issuance of Order Nos. 2769, 2843, and 2844 is warranted.

The recordkeeping violations alleged, in NOAV Nos. 2769, 2843, and 2844 are minor violations pursuant to NAC 445B.281. The violations in the NOAVs are the first, second, and third offense of recordkeeping violations for Lin Cubing in the previous 60 months. The administrative fine for a first offense recordkeeping violation is \$250.00, \$500.00 for the second, and \$1,000 for the third in accordance with NAC 445B.281. The total administrative fines for the violations for NOAV & Orders Nos. 2769, 2843, and 2844 is \$1,750.00. Pursuant to NAC 445B.283, the fines for minor violations must be submitted within 10 days of notice of the fines. The fines are payable by cashier's checks, certified checks, money orders or personal check. The check must be made payable to the State of Nevada and must be sent to the State Environmental Commission, 901 South Stewart Street, Suite 4001, Carson City, Nevada 89701-5249.

In accordance with NAC 445B.281 Violations: Classification; administrative fines, NOAV Nos. 2768, 2770, and 2771 constitute major violations. For major violations, NDEP makes penalty recommendations to the Nevada State Environmental Commission (SEC), but the SEC assesses the penalties. NDEP will be recommending a penalty of \$4,000 for NOAV No. 2768

and a penalty of \$15,000 for NOAV No. 2771. NOAV No. 2770 is being issued as a warning, so no penalty will be recommended. The date for the next SEC hearing is expected to be on June 9, 2021 but may be subject to change. It is possible that the SEC hearing will be conducted by teleconference due to the COVID-19 emergency. Before the hearing for the penalty, the SEC will notify you of the final date and time of the hearing and provide information about how you can participate if you want.

Appeals of NOAV Nos. 2768, 2769, 2770, 2771, 2843, and 2844 and Order Nos. 2769, 2843, and 2844 may be requested pursuant to Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 445B.360 Appeals to Commission: Appealable matters; action by Commission; regulations and SEC administrative rules. A copy of SEC Appeal Form #3 is enclosed. Appeals must be received within ten (10) days of receipt of this notice, pursuant to NRS 445B.340 Appeals to Commission: Notice of appeal. Additionally, The requirements of Order No. 2021EA-03 are hereby lifted effective February 17, 2021, but Lin Cubing must still submit records to the NDEP under the requirements of Order No. 2769, included with this letter. It should be noted that the fourth or greater occurrence of a minor violation within a 60-month period become major violation/s which are subject to penalties of up to \$10,000 per day, per violation, as assessed by the SEC.

Evidence:

Lin Cubing held a Class III AQOP to operate a hay cubing operation under the requirements of AQOP No. AP2048-3568, issued by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) on December 1, 2014. Lin Cubing currently operates under Class II Air Quality Operating Permit AP2048-4224, issued on June 26, 2020.

On May 31, 2019, NDEP staff conducted an EPA Method 9 visible emission test on the hay buster and associated transfers (System 01, PF 1.002) for six minutes. NDEP staff observed an opacity coming from the operation of 43%, which is 215% of the permitted opacity limit of 20%.

Evidence:

Lin Cubing Inc. (Lin Cubing) held a Class III Air Quality Operating Permit (AQOP) to operate a hay cubing operation under the requirements of AQOP No. AP2048-3568, issued by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) on December 1, 2014. Lin Cubing currently operates under Class II Air Quality Operating Permit AP2048-4224, issued on June 26, 2020.

In a letter dated January 13, 2017, NDEP notified Lin Cubing that regulatory changes, effective November 2, 2016, would require that the facility be permitted as a Class II source based on an analysis conducted by NDEP. The analysis consisted of an evaluation of the facility's potential to emit regulated pollutants based on the best data available at the time.

On letters dated March 12, 2019, and April 8, 2019, NDEP reminded Lin Cubing that their permit would be expiring on December 1, 2019. The letters also informed Lin Cubing that the application for a new Class II permit would need to be submitted before the permit expired.

On December 16, 2019, the NDEP discovered that an application for a new Class II AQOP for Lin Cubing's operations had not been submitted. A compliance inspection was conducted on the same day by the NDEP, the equipment listed on the expired permit was on site and the NDEP determined that the facility had operated beyond the December 1, 2019 permit expiration.

On March 25, 2020, NDEP held and enforcement conference with Lin Cubing. During the enforcement conference Lin Cubing was unable to show cause why NOAV No. 2771 should not be issued. NDEP has subsequently determined that formal issuance of NOAV No. 2771 is warranted.

In accordance with NAC 445B.281 Violations: Classification; administrative fines, the alleged violation constitutes a major violation, Lin Cubing has one prior air quality violation within the last 60 months.
