1) Call to Order, Roll Call, Establish Quorum (Discussion)

2) Public Comment:

Members of the public will be invited to speak before the SEC; however, no action may be taken on a matter during public comment until the matter itself has been included on an agenda as an item for possible action. Public comment may be limited to three minutes per person at the discretion of the chairperson.

3) Approval of December 4, 2019 Meeting Minutes (For Possible Action)

REGULATORY PETITIONS

4) Permanent Regulatory Petition R084-19: Bureau of Sustainable Materials Management (For Possible Action)

NDEP is proposing to amend NAC 444 to align with current federal hazardous waste regulations (adoption by reference) and to also address housekeeping items that clarify the existing regulations.

Recommendation: Approve and adopt permanent regulatory petition R084-19, as proposed, or take other action as appropriate.

5) Permanent Regulatory Petition R120-19: Bureaus of Air Quality Planning and Air Pollution Control (For Possible Action)

NDEP is proposing to amend NAC 445B to align with current federal air regulations (adoption by reference).

Recommendation: Approve and adopt permanent regulatory petition R120-19, as proposed, or take other action as appropriate.

6) Permanent Regulatory Petition R121-19: Bureau of Water Pollution Control (For Possible Action)

NDEP is proposing to amend NAC 445A with respect to wastewater operator certification and plants for sewage treatment classification.

Recommendation: Approve and adopt permanent regulatory petition R121-19, as proposed, or take other action as appropriate.

7) Permanent Regulatory Petition R018-20: Bureau of Mining Regulation & Reclamation (For Possible Action)

NDEP is proposing to amend NAC 445A with respect to an optional mining preapplication review process that will expedite the permitting process.

Recommendation: Approve and adopt permanent regulatory petition R018-20, as proposed, or take other action as appropriate.

8) Permanent Regulatory Petition R050-20: Bureau of Safe Drinking Water (For Possible Action)

NDEP is proposing to amend NAC 445A to align with the Nevada Board of Engineers for documents submitted by professional engineers.

Recommendation: Approve and adopt permanent regulatory petition R050-20, as proposed, or take other action as appropriate.

9) SEC Update Regarding Eureka Molly LLC's Mount Hope Mining Project (Discussion)

During the September 4, 2019 appeal hearing regarding the Mt. Hope mining project, the SEC upheld the reissuance of Water Pollution Control permit #NEV2008106. The SEC also directed NDEP to have discussions with the appellant, Great Basin Resource Watch, regarding specific issues raised during the hearing. The SEC directed NDEP to report back regarding these discussions. On February 18, 2020, Great Basin Resource Watch requested an opportunity to also provide the SEC with an update regarding post appeal hearing discussions.

- **10) Administrator's Briefing to the Commission: (Discussion)** Administrator Greg Lovato will brief the Commission on general management updates.
- 11) Public Comment: Members of the public will be invited to speak before the SEC; however, no action may be taken on a matter during public comment until the matter itself has been included on an agenda as an item for possible action. Public comment may be limited to three minutes per person at the discretion of the chairperson.
