Sections 10-12: Various revisions to water system pumping facility regulations.

4. A statement of the need for and purpose of the proposed regulations:

The proposed regulations need to be updated to follow best engineering practices and judgment. Several special exceptions to the existing NACs have been submitted and approved related to these proposed revisions, and many stakeholders have expressed frustration that best practices and judgment do not align with NAC 445A regulations. These amendments seek to revise the regulations to prevent special exceptions from having to be requested during project review.

In addition, there have been instances where older buildings do not have a backflow preventer on the fire line, which exposes the water system to contamination during a backflow event. When retrofitting buildings with backflow prevention, water systems have expressed concern over potential adversely affects a backflow device can have on the operation of a fire sprinkler system that protects life and property. Both the fire sprinkler system and public water system are key to protecting public health, life, and property, and both systems need to be designed to complement each other.
